Inns offer plenty of room for travelers

All along Interstate 20, hotels are popping up like wildflowers.

With several projects already in the works, a \$5 million, three-story full-service suite hotel, funded by a group of area physicians, has broken ground and is scheduled to open by fall 2007.

Completion of the 72-room Comfort Suites off River Watch Parkway, just east of the Microtel Inn and Suites at Exit 200, is set to coincide with the debut of The Villages at Riverwatch retail center. Om Duggal, a developer and hotel manager, said that with the new mall and the many restaurants, guests will have everything they need. Starting at \$79 a night, Comfort Suites will have a sauna and spa, and each room will be equipped with a plasma television and a computer, Mr. Duggal said. And just a stone's throw away, an extendedtay hotel, Value Place, is being built. Michael Bogue, the general contractor for MDH Builders Inc., which is overseeing the \$4 million project, said the 113-room hotel should be ready by the end of January. With weekly rates starting at \$169, rooms in the three-story hotel will include a kitchenette and furnishings for long-term stays, Mr. Bogue said. He said that another, 105-room Value Place, near the intersection of Gordon Highway and

Bobby Jones Expressway, will be finished by mid-February.

The Comfort Suites and Value Place will complement two other hotels on the same corner off the parkway, including a recently finished Baymont Inn & Suites and Mr. Duggal's 2-year-old <u>Microtel.</u>

The selection will offer weary travelers a variety of prices and hotel options.

"They've got the whole choice right here," Mr. Bogue s iid.
